Anju began her legal career in the City of London with Linklaters and Ashurst, before being appointed Partner at DLA Piper. In that role, she led a successful natural resources and regulatory law practice, combining legal advisory and transactional work with senior management responsibilities. Her practice centred on climate change regulation, renewable energy, and sustainable development, advising an international client base across government, industry, and finance.

She also served as Regulatory Counsel for the European assets of American Electric Power (AEP), overseeing coal-fired power stations and electricity supply operations. During her tenure, she played a pivotal role in positioning AEP as the first generator to produce renewable energy certificates through co-firing.

In recent years, Anju has acted as a senior consultant to MGT Teesside Limited, supporting the development, financing, and commissioning of the world's largest biomass power plant. As regulatory lead, she engaged with UK government departments on electricity sector policy, providing industry insights on support mechanisms including feed-in tariffs, renewable and carbon certificates, and Contracts for Difference.

Her international work includes advising the South African government on renewable energy development across sub-Saharan Africa. This encompassed the strategic design of a technical training hub to promote sustainable careers, analysis of private equity investment models for clean energy portfolios, and assessment of funding opportunities from European Development Finance Institutions. She also advised on the transition of World Bank CDM and development agency projects.

Anju has further supported the Qatari government on climate change policy and international negotiations. She has advised the Carbon War Room, the charity founded by Richard Branson, on procurement strategies to accelerate renewable energy transitions in Caribbean Island economies, and contributed to the Blue Horizons feasibility study on low-carbon marine cargo transport in Fiji using biodiesel and solar-battery technologies.

Throughout her career, Anju has provided strategic counsel on renewable energy and climate policy, serving on multiple legal and industry committees focused on renewable energy generation and environmental regulation. Her expertise spans regulatory frameworks, policy design, and stakeholder engagement. She brings extensive experience managing multi-disciplinary, multi-jurisdictional teams in both professional and voluntary capacities.
